Superintendent McIver furnishes us with the following approximate crop gathered on the Calidonia farm this year. Cotton 1,100 bales; Corn 15,000 barrels; Wheat, 6,000 bushels; Molasses, 70 barrels; Fodder, 300,000 bundles. Large quantities of clover and grass, some potato crops and a number of small crops that can not be estimated. There are about 5,000 acres in cultivation.
