Dear Wife I take the present

a few lines to let you hear
from me. I am well by
The Blessing of God. May I drop
you a few lines Sun fudays

Shoes pants hard Soap eggs
Buter 15 or 20 pounds of flour
flanel over Shiret copper red
paper I Dont want much
Bread if you cant cum ^{a ham}
Send it with Morris Benton
or James Daynood That will
pass Harris Dept the Bar of
GCT But if you can come
Come one and bring 2 or
3 hundred Dollars with you
and Dress up fine and nice

My dear Mac I have not had
much time to write to you
I rec'd your letter stating
about Harry Starr coming
down here I get all your letters
in 2 or 3 days from Bab I
rec'd one from J. M. C. today dated
the 24th sure thing it was in Dec
I have rec'd six letters in 4 or 5
last days " You can get some
one to stay with charity
to you go back nothing
