1910 to 1954. She was a member
of the Eastern Star, the Ladies
Auxiliary of Sycamore Hill Bap-
tist Church, and numerous other
clubs. She was also a member of
Sycamore Hill Baptist Church.

She is survived by a foster son,
R. M. Phillips of Greenville and
two foster grandsons.
