A page out of Harry Truman's campaign handbook will be good strategy for the remainder of this campaign. Those responsible for this irrationality were, of course, economic reactionaries who skillfully "used" the voters. We found that only about fifty per cent of the faculty and staff at East Carolina College were registered at the beginning of the campaign. Due largely to the determined efforts of James L. Fleming we got ninety per cent of them registered on time -- and checked the lists to make sure of this. Their response was most encouraging at the primary. They were called upon time and again to support you. As a result we carried those precincts where most of the faculty and staff live.
