IV. No perfon fball worite againfly the Gom vernment, nor against the perfons of any of the particular Cburches, thereby disturbing the Civil Peace,and creating Fends and Animofities among one anotber.
V. A large Book of the Fundamentals of the Government Sall be continually kept in the Regiftry.

V1. No perfon forlit bave any benefit of the Law there, nor any place what foever, nor Trade nor Merchandize in that place, unle $\beta$ be Gall fubfcribe the Dath or Dectaration fol sowing.

- I I $\dot{A} B$. do promife and declare, that I will continue fteadfalt inmy Obedience to, and in the Defence of Charlos the II cour prefent King, againft all oppofitions what foever, as alfo his Heirs and Succeffors: And I do alfo declare, that I will defend the Palatine Lords and proprietors of this Place and Governmenr, as is is now Conftitured, againft all their - Enemies.
VII. All Aliens, by the aforefaid Sub. foription jooll be Naturalized.
