Halifax N.S.

Nov. 14th 1833.

Sir

On the 23^d Oct. last I succeeded in shipping
1900 Staves on your & Blanchards account. which
was consigned to Miles Nash & Co. Norfolk N.S.

I should have written you before but did not
think it necessary, as all was safe on your account.
I ascertained the number of Staves which has been
taken off of your Land up to the time the last
were shipped,

This number of Pipe Staves are admitted by both
Jossey & Blanchard to have been got off of your
Land, and they tell me they have yet remaining
some considerable number, which Enoch King
is hauling down to Halifax every day.

There is a Schooner now at our Landing
wanting to take away all the Staves he can get
Please let me know if you have Control of
the Staves now hauling to this place & if so do

you wish them shipped before all has been sent
down if so I will have what is here put on
board in a few days @ also all that King
may haul within the next 4 or 5 days or perhaps
10 days
