Wilmington Georgia Jan 16th 1833

I have been looking a long time for a letter
from you, but have been disappointed. I have search
ed Thomas Neville he sold my claim on J. S.
Carstarphen to Owen D. Carstarphen at 25 Plant
which I am able to prove by Joseph S. Carstarphen
and James H. Carstarphen. Also Owen D. Carstarphen
for Owen gave 25 Plant to Joel Walker for the
money I wrote to you requesting you to bring suit
if your agency would admit Joseph S. Carstarphen
lives in Talbot County Georgia. James H.
Carstarphen lives in Putnam County Georgia.
I do not think it would be possible to hitch Owen
as he still keep traveling of negroes

I have got the Original Contract and power of
attorney which I gave Neville from Joseph S.
Carstarphen which is assign over to Owen D.

- Cartarphen By Thomas Neville thence by Owen
D. Cartarphen To Joseph A. Cartarphen Satisfied

I have a Certificate signed by J. A. Cartarphen saying
that he will swear that Owen D. Cartarphen held in his
possession for the payment of that debt to ^{the} ~~the~~ Negroes
at the time that Neville sold the debt to Owen D.
Cartarphen which Negroes Neville could have claimed
if he would under a covenant between the The Brothers
In my name and that Neville sold the debt
his Brother Owen at 25 \$ but for he were present when it
was sold. I have only sold three of my negroes but do
expect to part from the Balance in a few days

I shall ^{be} about Millidgeville my correspondence with
me I will attend to with the strict attention at Millidge
ville I am with as common my best respects to you and
all Inquiring Friends I am Yours
