My Dear Comis

I enjoyed your
last letter very much & have
waited longer than I intended
to reply to it. I was not at
all well when first I was writing
of my stay here - am much
better now but still does not
take much exerting & shame
me in this high altitude.
I have taken up carpentry
learnt three rooms and
have two others to do. Have
also done considerable sew-
ing - have made a cloak
without dress & two collars
for Bonney besides about a
dozen other garments.

I have had great trouble
to get a good servant - the one
who was here when I came
remained until some weeks
ago - she find & got after she left
was a nice, good Irish girl,
very warlike & more bold in
look - dark hair & dark eyes
is a laundry - she will have

a coarse, common girl - a
perfet-tomraugard - at the
end of three days, she
gave me much impudence
that I told her, she must leave
the one I have now, is a good
girl but badly deformed from
walking of the spine and I
do not believe, will be able to
do the work. We expect uncle
James & probably aunt G. Maria
& many the first of June. Uncle
L. is going to visit the different
mining districts & may remain
in Colorado until October. He
has recently given Billie & five
thousand dollars - gave him
L. ten thousand last fall &
Boris five thousand - saying
he is going to stop for a while.
I think, he might fully and
sincerely open his heart to
some of the others before he stops.
I have not the same confidence
in Maggy's man's sincerity -
she should be full just as we do
towards aunt G. & her relations
and esp. she acts and talks
as if she thought fit. They are
just right - she is amiable
but easily influenced & some-
