A sweet letter from you this morning and I long to answer - You, too, ought to receive one from me this morning -

As this is 1<sup>st</sup> of August, you of course will remember it is a very busy time with me - so <sup>or day</sup> being a big time with the "roads" in town and all hands being anxious to go, I deviated from my usual custom & payed them off last night & early this morning -

Andrew made the "smoothest" report I have ever yet had - It was almost too satisfactory - Not a complaint being made pro or con - something out of the usual course of things with my "business manager" - However I did not let on at all and with a few encouraging words I hope he will

do as well as a white man. He had his hands grubbing yesterday in the new ground, and just at night, he caught the pony and rode over to inspect the work, I could but think as he went off he was the hoppiest "dartist" I ever saw. Madru and his employer have split. He has written me to try and assist him to get a situation. And I saw him in town yesterday, but we didn't talk about living together, I thought he wanted to, but was evidently ashamed to mention the subject.

Jimmie about half promised to come here to night, and if so, you may just bet we will have a good time tomorrow. Don't you wish you could see in on us? And just here I am reminded to tell you that good story on the Johnnie (confidentially of course). Willie one day <sup>was</sup> exceedingly solicitous to know where the baby came from? Johnnie told him that "Dr Wilson put his
