My Dear Sir

I have this day sent you by Express fifty (50) Bags and will be under many obligations if you will fill them with the Johnson cotton seed and forward them to me by freight train

or if you cannot get them please send me some of yours. If you can deliver them to R. Rapt at Lawboro and order him to send them by freight train care R. R. apt

Meldon. They will come
all right. Please write me
the cost of them &c and
I will remit you the amount
by Express at once. I have
been very much troubled
about seed. I engaged some
from Col Beck at 40.cts per
bushel. But he sold them
all out before I sent for
mine. We will all be
very glad to have you come
up and visit us We are
now living in Henderson

By getting me these
seed you will very
much oblige your
kinsman and obdt
servt
