a letter from me I have nothing new  
to write I have been as well as usual  
until the last few days I have taken  
medicine hope I shall soon be as well  
as usual Your Papas is not well complain  
a good deal I hope you are all well  
don't stay down to long Doc Edgar thinks  
you all will be subject to have Chills  
again as you had them last year your  
Sister Matilda's health is very bad she  
will go on North in a few days  
her health may improve how is it  
I am in hopes her health is better how is Elias  
getting on with his farm the farmers com-  
plain of being very backward I hear Solo-  
mon Williams say this Overseer in Halifax  
employed his hands from Petersburg I was  
down to see Martha Harry they are put  
up to get House Servants in thatough-  
borhood they have a great deal to do ~~themselves~~

Excuse all this written down up

Cooking and washing they have  
~~some of them~~ washing Machines they  
would not be without one Martha  
said her washer would be all the  
week about their washing and ironing  
and would not get through and now  
she says she can get through in  
less than a day buying her one  
they find it great convenience Mary  
Ann has been to see us & she is now at  
Genes Daniel came up she wrote  
me Jenny had broke her self down  
washing & ironing said if she was  
able she would get her one so you  
will see from that how bad of

he said he liked the situation better  
than any lot in Town he is restless  
and cant stay long at a place either  
to be going my love to Sis Bet & the  
children Our book was taken the other  
day with Paraliser in the street how  
uncertain is life let us then live  
now and wish to see well I will come

Children would y<sup>e</sup> been pleased Friday  
to of seen the turn out at the College  
They had celebration and invited the  
Students from Petrels Wake forest and  
other places I understand it was about  
about 8 hundred Farewell pray the Lord
