If you can compromise it in any way do so dont wait to hear from me for I am satisfied you will do the best you can. and more than likely I would not do as well with it as you can. I would be very glad to get the face of the note - payable the 1st of January. I would be glad to hear from you as soon as you can ascertain any information concerning it. I am sending money now very much. and if they ever intend paying any thing they can make a better thing of it than any other time. If the Estate is good as Shepherd says I dont see how they can well get out of it. so when you come up the country you must come and bring El to see us - do -
