Swingide May 21st 1869.

My Dear Sir

I am sorry to inform you that I am disappointed at last, in my contemplated visit to you — the rain broke us up at the time fixed on to start, and now I am engaged taking the tax list for my District — I was sorry to learn that you had to replant your cotton — the stand of cotton generally in our section is very imperfect, my own not all up yet when planted three or four weeks ago — the seed you sent me I planted in the check in order to make the most of them, and but few seed are up yet, I shall sock other seed today and replant it — Mr Henry who is with us unity in law to all and says that you must not stay ~~down~~ too long down the country —

Months was very much disappointed
in not getting to see you, all and
love - I fear the *Lospedezia striata*
is a failure with me - I got your
packet of the seed or dirt and if
any of it is up, I don't know it yet -
