June 17th 1869

Cousin Elias

I failed in getting the money from Carr in L. Willard, and regret that I loaned the amt - 25\$ from you, (as you said you needed what you had on hand) since I am not going to school as expected and could have possibly done without it. I have no idea what his motive was for promising it, and then failing to comply. He promised me (as I told you) that he would send me the money the last of May or there-about, and when I wrote him for the same

said he could not let me have  
it. Had he told me frankly  
that he could not or would  
not let me have it I would  
have been perfectly satisfied  
but as it is he kept me  
waiting when I might have  
been doing something. I am  
now trying to get in business.  
I heard from Mr Conway  
a few days since he is in  
N.Y. City in a mesquite house.  
The crops in this neighborhood  
rather backward. Cousin Sam  
is getting on very well, harmonious  
with his. I will be glad to  
hear from you. Direct to  
Balltown.
