Dr Elias:

Since I saw you Saturday morning, I have been not a little interested and concerned about our affairs with W^m Carr - and have concluded to make this proposition to you - would like to have seen you in person, that we might have talked the matter more fully, but as I go down to work this morning, must content myself by writing, believing that I ^{can} satisfactorily explain what I propose and hope, and at the same time, ^{believe} under certain circumstances, it may be prudent for you to accept. It is this:

That you furnish him with the money desired, say, (I think) \$1200. and the amt due to me about \$2100.00 - which will make his indebtedness to you about \$8000.00 and about consolidate his debts or fix them so that you will be his principal creditor.

You can say to him, that I need my ~~my~~ money, and the amt that will be due to you, will fully justify you in asking for a mortgage on property to secure you - Now all this is proposed to be done, believing that you ^{can} conveniently spare from your business the above amts - If this arrangement can be made, it will be an accommodation to me, and it will, I think, better enable you to secure yr debt
