My dear Husband,

We reached here safely about one o'clock, over the worse roads I most ever saw. Sam met me at the Depot, had his horses under perfect-control, and they look real nice, had a new pair of blankets on them when the Cars came up and looked very stylish.

Sister Bet insisted so much on my staying until the morning concluded to do so, and we went up to see
