Standing at the head of the Eastwood Herd is King 2d 11570, now in his sixth year, an animal of grand points in a dairy cow pro-genitor. In the judgment of the writer he possesses the important points as adopted by the A. J. C. Club, May, 1885, and from the beginning he has made in the Eastwood Herd

He is the fourth generation only removed in direct descent from Coomassie, who was, in the opinion of the writer, the greatest foundation Jersey cow that ever lived, the list of her tested progeny being now about one hundred and fifty. One hundred head of Coomassies sold for an average price of \$1,663.10, aggregating \$166,310 for 100 head of her progeny.

her dam are not members of the Eastwood Herd, and are only shown to represent the identical blood elements in King 2d. She was one of the best cows in the famous Shoemaker Herd, and was bought before she was tested at \$2,000.

KING'S PRINCESS is a typical dairy cow in looks and performance, being a long, persistent milker. She was tested nearly six months after calving and three months in calf, and produced in 14 days 48 lbs. 10 oz. of butter. Her feed was four quarts each of wheat bran and corn meal and one quart of pea meal per day, two feeds, morning and evening, with as much good blue-grass as she could eat. 

Her girth after calving, around the largest part of the body, was $68\frac{1}{2}$ inches; her height was 3 feet $4\frac{3}{4}$ inches; her udder measured 37 inches in circumference; fore udder, from setting on





is an inbred Coomassie, sired by King 2d; dam, Imported Clearwater, a granddaughter of Vertumnus P. 161 H. C., a persistent milker, yielding at her best flow 22 qts. The feed of King's Clearwater during test was 6 quarts corn meal and bran mixed, a pint of pea meal and plenty of good blue-grass. She yielded one pound of butter from 7,100 lbs. of milk, which, according to established tables, ranks her, in the order of richness of milk, No. 26.

ONA'S ISLAND STAR 16503 was the sweeps bull over all breeds at the Baldwin District

Fair Association, October 18, 19, 20 and 21, 1887, at Staunton, Va. This youngster, now only 15 months ol ', was selected by Mr. Miller to breed to King 2d's heifers. He was sired by Gold Coast, Jr. 9217, a son of Island Star. His dam, Ona 7840, was thought by excellent judges to be a better cow than Princess 2d, though her butter record is not half that of her sister (Princess 2d). His breeding is faultless, in our judgment. We could not take from or add to one animal that would improve it. We can not give a better description of him than is found on the back of his photograph, now in the office of the BREEDER, and which we copy. He descends from Coomassie, through four crosses, obtaining 213 per cent. of her blood. He comes twice from

Khedive P. 103 C., being a grandson and a great-great-grandson, getting 31⁺/₄ per cent. of his blood. He is a grandson (f Island Star, the best daughter of Guy Fawkes. She has a butter record of 21 lbs 3 oz. in 7 days. Has four crosses to Welcome 166, getting 10.83 per cent of the blood of this wonderful sire; traces sixteen times to Old Noble, a bull that has more noted descenda ts than any other Jersev bull known to the writer; four times to Browny 113; once to Orange Peel 129; once to Orange Skin, and twice to Sultan 58. a page or two in the BREEDER. He is solid color, shading to a brown bay, with light fawn under the belly and legs; very rich skin, four well developed and well spread teats, and well developed milk veins; small, finely modeled head. I might say he is simply perfect in form and disposition.

KING KOFFEE 5522.—Inbred son of Coom: assie 1874, grandson of Guy F-wkes F. 251 H. C. This bull has recently been added to the Eastwood Herd. His pedigree is rich in jewels of the first water. King Koffee is only six years old and we find him credited with

A LOVER OF THOROUGHBREDS.

THE CHESHIRE HOG.

The Cheshires have grown steadily in favor with farmers and breeders wherever they are grown. In central New York four out of every five white hogs show Cheshire breeding. There is a prejudice with butchers there against black skinned hogs, either for the block or for packing. The Chester Whites are large, coarse, and long in maturing, as well as heavy in offal. Small Yorks are a lard hog and off in quality of meat on that account. The Cheshires are white, thin-skinned, very light in offal, mature early; prolific as breeders, excellent as mothers; are

very quiet in disposition, and are unexcelled in quality of meat. In 1880 the Britton Bros., then just growing into prominence as breeders and exhibitors, became earnest advocates of a Cheshire Herd Book. These efforts, ably seconded by R. E. Coe, and other breeders, resulted in uniting the various strains and interests in a permanent record and a standard of excellence was adopted. This record has grown in favor until all the prominent breeders are its advocates. They hope to publish the first volume in 1888.
