Dear Bro.

As secretary of Cabarrus Co. Alliance I have many questions to decide, some of which give me much trouble. One I cannot find out from the Constitution. I will give you the case. An Alliance has been organized with (10) ten members, it has been organized about five mos. They have taken in about 10 members by admit and one or two by initiation. The no of Charter members 10 - and 2. by initiation does not reach 16, but the 10 by admit makes them number 22. They hold that they do not have to turn over the 25<sup>th</sup> to the Co.

Alliance until they take in by initiation a sufficient number to pay Charter fee, which will be 16 members. Is that true? Please let me know. I am satisfied if the Alliance had not reached 16 by any means, either admit or initiate, they could retain their initiation fee until they reached 16 members, but how about it when they number 22, 12 by initiation & 10 by admit. Let me hear from you.
