I have this day ordered out Twenty Thousand Yards of Cotton Bagging from the Lane Mills to be shipped on the 5th Oct. As the goods are shipped the Mills draw Sight Drafts and forward to Bank here for Collection. None of the goods have been ^{arrived} ~~delivered~~ from the Lane Mills and several bills have not been paid to me. I have paid all & have some of the \$3000 placed in my hands for the payment of this bagging, but when the 20,000 yds is shipped if they draw at sight, and it is about

at the various depots, and then
the Sub Agents, send me the Money
after the goods arrive. The Sight
Draft drawn for the whole amt
on me will be due before
any money comes in from

The Lane Mills. ship to parties
on my order, but draw on
me for whole amt. If you
think best to place non funds,
so that in case I need it I
