Mr. Elias, base Res W. C. F. A.

Dear Sir and Bro, I hope  
you will not think it presumptuous  
in our humble private to confer  
with you. At the Jan- meeting of  
Catholics to meeting of F. A. I was  
appointed one of three on a committee  
on legislation, and after mature  
consideration, & have concluded to write  
you. There is a great deal of general  
legislation <sup>needed</sup> that can only be effected
