Dear Sir - I have looked into the matter of the costs of which you spoke to me the other day, and am satisfied that the amount \$5⁰⁰ in each of the two cases was paid to you by me in my office, on the day of the distribution of the fund - about the 14th of April 1889. I have turned to my file and find the memoranda, Cal- culations, etc., concerning the distribution. I had in hand \$1670⁰⁰ for dis- tribution and the costs of the two cases \$6⁰⁰. Mr. White says I came to his office the day of the distribution of the fund and told him I wanted the balance of the costs advanced in the two cases, as you were here and I wanted to settle the costs with you. I find, too, your letter of the 8th of April 1889 in which you write to me, "You will remember I advanced the least costs \$10⁰⁰ and that I also have a small claim against - Dr. R. C. Williams. So upon the whole I think it - but I should be paid at the distribution". I find also that you charged no Commission for collecting the fund and were satisfied with the repayment to you of your personal expenses which amounted to twenty dollars, one fourth of which was paid by each of Dr. Williams, Mr. A. Helm, Mr. Harris and myself. The Dr. Williams debt - was also paid and upon my making it - to him.
