At the state convention of N.C. last Aug there was a convention of tobacco men from the tobacco district, and the state convention passed a resolution recommending a convention to be called for the tobacco district to consider the question of selling & manufacturing tobacco. In order to carry out that resolution there was a call for a convention of the tobacco district on 13th of Nov. 1888 at Durham, & that convention the object of the convention was defined & clarified in 7 facts & a call made for all sub-alliance in the tobacco district to send delegates to Durham on the 5th of Dec 1888. & at that conm two resolutions were passed unanimously as published in Progressive Farmer of L. 25th 1888.

Please examine the resolution in state proceedings & the proceedings published

in Progressive Farmer of Dec 25th held in
Durham & write me if you do not think we, as
tobacco men & F.A. ought not to stand squarely
by those resolutions & not grant any Alliance
except the county Alliance permission to
manufacture tobacco. The question was fully
discussed & the resolution passed unanimously
in the full belief that sub-alliance & Cents
road factories would be of great disadvantage
instead of beneficial to the tobacco raisers.
Please write me at once what your decision
is.
