The colored man that I know there now, is  
one of the best negroes in our section, and  
he says he wants to rent again his name  
is William Williams, Our crops are good  
but the decline in cotton hurts terribly  
we have had a fine fall for growing crops,  
yet many of us are behind in picking out,  
labour is scarce, I hope to be able to pay  
you what I am owing you this winter,  
I am very much rejoiced at the result of
