I have written to the Leaksville Mills that I will take all their second hand Bagging (heavy) at 60 cts. pr Bale, which is to include the ties. They propose to manufacture the Odenheimer Bagging, 44 inches wide weighing  $\frac{3}{4}$  lb. pr. yd. at 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  cts. delivered, f. o. b. less 2%.

I have written to them agreeing to take 15,000 yds. the 1<sup>st</sup> Sept, 15,000 the 1<sup>st</sup> Oct. and 15,000 the 1<sup>st</sup> Nov. subject to your approval. That is about the quantity they will manufacture.

What shall I do about the order given to Odenheimer?

I have seen a great many Alliance-men in the last two weeks, and received a great many letters; and I think the feeling is universal in the Alliance that we must stand by the action of the Birmingham Convention.
