The question as to whether the 5 cents per capita Dues payable by the State Secretaries was due in advance or at the end of the year was settled by the Supreme Council at Ocala as follows:

"The per Capita Dues shall be Five cents due annually in advance on the first day of November, with the last day of grace February first following"

The per capita Dues from your State are therefore past due for the year ending October 1<sup>st</sup> 1891 and should be paid as soon as possible on the male membership in your state on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Oct. 1890.

Please report to me at once what your male membership was at that date so that I may close my books for the year and let me know when you will be able to make a remittance
