The season is near when you will begin to need Cotton Bagging, so we send you quotations given us by different parties with whom we have been corresponding. These quotations are for the present and are subject to fluctuation.

1st. Clean heavy sacks cut and sewed together in sheets measuring 1 1/4 by 3 yards, weighing 1 1/2 lbs. at 4 3/4 cents per yard.

2nd. Sacks about 15000 in the lot for 10 cts. per bag, net cash F. O. B. Phila. or New York.

3rd. Sacks weighing from 2 to 2 3/4 lbs. at from 7 1/2 to 10 cts. according to weight. F. O. B. New York or Phila.

4th. 2 lb. Bagging (Anti Trust) delivered at New Berne for 7 1/2 cts. per yard. (The Manufacturer has never been a member of the Trust)

5th. Best Jute Bagging (Anti Trust) 1 3/4 lbs. at 7 3/4 cts.

6th. Dundee Bagging, 3 yds to piece, weighing 2 lbs. per yard at 6 cts. per yard.

7th. Bagging made from Cotton, 44 in. wide, weighing 12 oz. at 12 1/2 cts. per yard.

We also have samples of Pine Straw Fibre Bagging, and Cotton Stalk Fibre Bagging. Have no quotations of the latter.

I have an offer of 5000 Bales of Pieced ties, No. 1, delivered in Raleigh at \$1.00 per Bundle.

Last season we were greatly annoyed because of the delay in getting our Cotton Bagging. Let us decide what we will use this year and have it on hand at the beginning of the season. The probability is that there will be an advance in price and we can contract for it now to be delivered when we want it.
