Dear Sir:

It has occurred to us that a modification of the Sub-Treasury Plan proposed by the National Farmers' Alliance and Industrial Union might be put into operation, to a limited extent and immediately, without waiting for government endorsement.

What is to hinder the Alliance or Grange of any county from building its own warehouse, appointing a competent superintendent, and storing the products of the members until such time as they can command the best market prices. Loans could be secured on the value of the products stored, and the County Alliance, thus negotiating as a whole, should be able to get better rates both for loans and on the sale of products than individuals can do at present.

We should be pleased to get an expression from you in this matter, indicating to what extent, in your opinion, such a plan of co-operation could be put into practice.
