This Bureau was established with a view of gathering from all sections of the Union, news and data concerning the Alliance and the Reform movement, and disseminating it to all our papers from a common centre. The Bureau was left self sustaining; and the letters being sent out are charged far at the rate of fifty cents per week. You can easily see what a power for good this Bureau can be of to the support of our leading Alliance and Reform papers can be secured. Can you intrust yourself so far as to suggest to your State papers that they take these weekly letters? The work is so expensive, and to be conducted properly ought to have a liberal support.
