

The Annual Session of this Institute will begin the last Monday in August, '85, and close on the last Thursday in May, '86.

The Annual Session will consist of two terms of twenty weeks each. The New methods of instruction will be strictly adhered to, as we believe they are productive of the best results; and we are determined to give pupils as good advantages as they can obtain at other schools of like grade.

The Discipline will be as mild as possible, yet firm, and in this Parents and Guardians will be expected to co-operate with the Principal; for the progress of the pupil depends very largely upon such co-operation.

Pupils will receive such instruction as will fit them for a successful career in life.

Students can enter any time during the session, but it is far better for them to enter at the beginning if possible.
