Have just received your letter and read it with astonishment as I had not been in possession of the ~~the~~ Economist of May 9. I have read the piece referred to, and at once wrote to Bro Maccune in regard to it calling his attention not only to paragraph in E. but to the Demands made at Ocala by the Supreme Council. I am sure that it must be different from what he intended. I called his attention to the possible danger to the Southern Alliance and asked to hear from him at once. Glad you called my attention to it.

He told me the paper must fight on the demands and be more aggressive than ever and it should start from now. Next week I hope to be in possession of the Rural Home again the management of which had gone out of my control in January. I shall reduce the price to 5 cents a year and will endeavor to put it in every Alliance household in N.C. Never was
