DEAR SIR:--

At a meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Columbian Dairy Association held at Chicago, July 30, it was decided that the committee will be unable to present plans and specifications to the Commissioners of the World's Fair, in October, commensurate with the importance of the dairy industry, without a full interchange of views. Have the kindness to answer the following questions at your earliest convenience:

1. Do you think it practical to continue the exhibition of dairy cattle during the entire six months of the fair?
2. Should exhibits of dairy stock be unlimited as to number and quality, or restricted by the Commission?
3. Can you give me an estimate of the dairy cattle, either by cattle clubs or individuals, that will probably be exhibited?
4. Do you or do you not think it would be for the interest of the breeders of dairy cattle to exhibit such cattle in conjunction with the general dairy exhibit rather than with the general live stock exhibit?
5. Will you give me your judgment as to the best methods of exhibiting dairy cattle?
6. Shall we have a working dairy during the entire fair?

Your answers to the above questions, and any estimate or suggestions that you may give us, will be of great value to our committee in presenting to the Commissioners the wants and needs of the dairy industry in making an exhibit that will command the commendation and approval of all visitors.
