Dear Sirs

We have put off answering your letter, until we could dispose of your damaged pickings.

We note what you say about the O.S. Cactor losing so heavily in weight. We wrote you May 26th that we had to pick off one bale of this mark. 79 lbs. Another bale, that we rendered you sales as being numbered. 34 we had to pick off 124 lbs. Two other bales, # 10 & 15. We had to pick for being damaged, but can't give you amounts picked, because we did not weigh them before picking them. Two bales we did not pick, because we worked them off by making allowance of 7 lbs each for damage. Hope the above explanation will prove satisfactory. We have sold your pickings, as follows.

Less labor paid for picking	5.50
Amount placed to your credit	\$25.00
