A Bureau of Immigration was established at the request of the State Alliance held at Fayetteville in 1889, & Prof. John Allen was placed in charge of same, with an allowance of \$150. for advertising &c. which was not shown in the published proceedings of that meeting, and the death of Prof. Allen, nothing along that line has been done. In view of the Inter-State Exposition to be held in Raleigh this fall & the probability of visiting attending it, with a view of bettering this condition by a change of <sup>residence</sup> ~~residence~~, I thought of issuing a Circular letter to Alliance men in the State with a view of aiding them in the sales of sample lands, timber, water power, &c. which perhaps I could not do without invalidating my eligibility as an Alliance man.



The Chairman of my Co Ex Com. Prof C Scobor  
ough has authorized me to go ahead; but  
I do not want to do anything not entirely  
correct as an Alliance man & write to ask  
for opinions & the advisability of doing such  
things. I don't wish to be understood  
as asking any aid from the State Treasury  
in this work. I would be glad you write me
