

diameter is 3 inches at the butt end, just in front of the shoulder, the probabilities are it is a regular 3 inch wagon but in that case, we think you will find the length 9 inches, between the shoulder and inside of nut when the latter is screwed up tight.

It would be better perhaps to satisfy yourselves on this point before directing shipment and it is not improbable the descriptive list on page 17 in our catalogue will assist you in determining the size.
