Dear Bro; Carr,

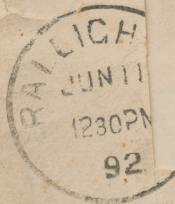
Yours of 7th of June was found on my table yesterday on my return from Wake Forest Commencement. Hence the delay.
