My dear Sir,-

I am indignant about certain information which comes to my knowledge today. I learn that it has been represented to Senator Rawson that there was intense feeling throughout the county regarding the appointment of a Post-Master at this place, and that there was a general uprising of the people in the county to condemn and denounce me for assuming to "dictate" the appointments in the county. All of this comes from two or three persons. It is false and outrageously unjust. There is no feeling on the subject, and so far from attempting to "dictate" about the offices I have declined to have anything to do with them except the post-office here. When I reflect that I gave five months unremitting labors to the party and probably impaired permanently my health from exposure and overwork, I do feel

that I am wronged by these reports.
I write to request that you will write Senator Ransom
regarding these representations. I would not trouble
you but for the fact that I feel hurt and grossly
wronged. I would be glad if you would furnish me
with a copy of such letter as you may write.
