My dear Friend,

Your letter was received and I assure you duly appreciated by myself and family. I expect to begin a new house in 30 days. Just as soon as crops are "landed by" I will put up the frame and get enough finished to "winter in" and finish ~~as~~ as I may be able. Surely I have had a rough road for twenty years, and as the end began to beam in sight suddenly it is again far removed. But there is one "higher than I" and the end will come some time. Better my fourth daughter has typhoid fever but is decidedly on the mend this week. We are in my granary a two story building 20x20 ft except my room which is over the kitchen a good two story log house of some size. We have been much more comfortable but might be much worse off.

I would have been glad to be on Chapel Hill and hope to meet you there at Centennial. I thank the undertaking of Durham, Bailey and a few other of my Baptist brethren to have nine months public school and all the students needed to make them self supporting on the denominational Cal-  
leges by withdrawing the \$20,000 <sup>per year</sup> the more of

terrible I have known since 1864 when the  
stock low was "coming" in our section; a very  
worthy old friend (Mr. Abernathy) said he believed  
it would come and he intended "to get ready for  
it and the next time I go to Charlotte I intend  
to get a part of Clover seed and sow a  
large pasture."

We now have a new era in this County B. C.

to yourself and family -

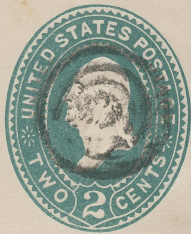
