"The few who can understand the system" he says "will be either so interested in its profits, or so dependent on its favors, that there will be no opposition from that class. while on the other hand the great body of the people mentally incapable of comprehending the tremendous advantages that capital derives from this system, will bear its burdens without complaint, & perhaps without even suspecting that the system is inimical to their interests." Please advise us freely as to this matter, & also state whether or not you will be of assistance to us if we concluded to establish a Nat. Bank in the city of N.Y. etc etc

of your letter of June 25 inst in which you re-
fer to a communication recd from the Hon
John Sherman of Ohio, with references to the
advantages & profits of an American investment,
under the provisions of our National Banking
act. The fact that Mr Sherman speaks well of
such an investment, or of an similar one is
certainly not without weight, for that gentleman
possesses in a marked degree the distinguish-
ing characteristics of the modern successful
financier, his temperament is such that whatever
his feelings may be they never cause him to
lose sight of the main chance. He is young
shrewd & ambitious. He has fixed his eye upon

the presidency of the U.S. & is already a member
of Congress. He rightly thinks that he has
every thing to gain both politically & financially,

Dear Father,

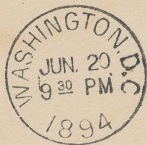
