Yours of the 7th. instant received. After due deliberation I signed and sent the letter you refer to, to a member of the Finance Committee, asking the confirmation of Mr. Simmons to be Collector of the Eastern District of North Carolina.

I was led, primarily, to ask Mr. Simmons' confirmation for services rendered the party in the last campaign; and, secondarily, that the failure to have him confirmed would be hurtful to the party in the State, in that the Republicans & Populists propose to make his failure of confirmation a basis of the conduct of the next campaign, involving the issue of fraud in the last election.

In writing such letter I was only claiming for myself a right I am willing to accord to the humblest member of the party-an expression of preference for a faithful party servant. Because of my endorsement of Mr. Simmons you are not warranted in asserting "I am taking sides with Ranson against you".

I deny also, most emphatically the existance of any machine in the party, save that of whose work you and I have been the beneficiaries-you oftener than I.I cannot withdraw the letter, tho' the request had been couched in more courteous terms.
