Yours of 25th inst. saying that you have despaired of any improvement in the price of Cotton, received. You instruct us, that unless we see some prospect for an early rise in price, to dispose of Mrs Carr & Son's Cotton.

Your Cotton will grade Strict Midd. to Good Middling, & is worth, or should bring, $7\frac{1}{4}$ ¢. On acct of this time of year being "between seasons," & the market very dull, & depressed, & a constant decline for two or three weeks. We can not sell it here now, & probably not till next Season opens, except at a sacrifice. We fear that $6\frac{7}{8}$ is the most we could get for it in this market, at this time.

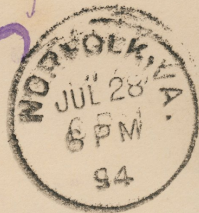
