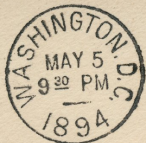
My dear Mr. Carr,

dear husband.

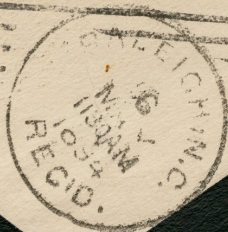
It is only heaven that
