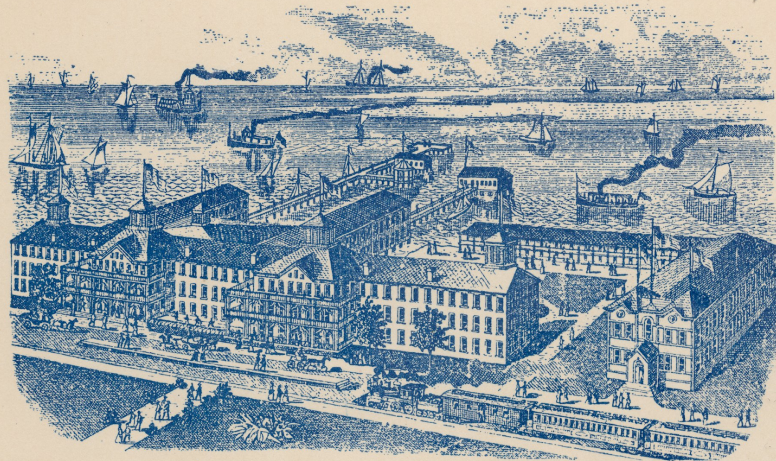


MAIN DINING-ROOM—ATLANTIC HOTEL.

Morehead City is beautifully situated on Beaufort harbor, within one mile of the ocean, and at the eastern terminus of the Atlantic & North Carolina Railroad. Eminent physicians have pronounced this the best place for consumptive patients, for anæmic women and teething children on the continent.

Atlantic Hotel. The Atlantic Hotel, with accommodations for over 1,000 guests, is the most popular resort on the Atlantic Coast, and will be open from **May 10th to October 1st, 1894**. This extensive hotel is so located on the beach of Bogue Sound within a short distance of the surf, and has such a system of salt-water sewerage, that it is *absolutely exempt from malaria* and the insects so insupportable at most summer resorts. Mosquitoes and flies are unknown evils here.

Cuisine. The cuisine will be all that can be desired, and the service the best that can be secured. The table will be supplied with Soft-shell Crabs, Shrimp, Scollops, Oysters, Clams, Spanish Mackerel, Blue-fish, Speckled Trout and other species of sea food, in addition to meats from Chicago and the products of our home markets.

Rooms. The rooms are well furnished in cherry with hair mattresses, and are supplied with water, gas and electric bells. Hot and cold water baths and closets on every floor, and telegraph, post and express offices in the building.

Amusements. The amusements are varied. Here you can indulge in surf-bathing, still-water bathing, fishing, boating and hunting. The surf-bathing is unsurpassed and the formation of the beach is of such a nature that there is absolutely no undertow, and guests can revel in this health-giving sport with perfect safety. Still-water bathing in commodious bath-houses at end of pier or in sound in front of hotel. The fishing here is the very best on the coast. The Spanish Mackerel, Blue-fish, Pompano and Cero furnish rare sport to those who enjoy trolling in the white-winged sharpies which ply the ocean, and the more timid can fish at the end of the pier within a few feet of their rooms.
