two pairs of sheets, one counterpane and two pillow-cases, and one teaspoon for use in their rooms.

We most earnestly request parents to see that their daughters have all their outfit prepared before coming to school, so as to avoid loss of time in having dresses to purchase and be made. This is a great drawback to their progress and improvement, and parents should see that this tax is not imposed upon them.

Absences.

No student should be absent from the Institute during the session, except during the Christmas holidays; and then all absences beyond the prescribed period will be counted against the absentee in the bestowal of the honors of the Institute.

In no instance will the Principal give consent to the absence of a student from the Institute to visit the home of another at Easter, Thanksgiving, or at any other time while the school is in session.

Visiting.

Visitors coming from the homes of the students must present letters of introduction to the Principal from the parents or guardians of those upon whom they wish to call. They will then be permitted to call at such times as do not conflict with regular school and study hours.

Visits of young men will not be permitted, except at our regular, stated receptions.

Visitors will not be admitted on Sunday.

Pupils will be permitted to visit friends in the city occasionally, but not on Sunday.

Correspondence.

Students who expect to succeed have no time for extended correspondence, and should write to the home circle only.

They will be permitted to correspond with those gentlemen only whose names are given in writing by their parents.

Conditions of Entrance, Etc.

We wish to call special attention to the following conditions upon which we receive students:

Pupils desiring to enter the higher classes must furnish, by examination or certificate, satisfactory evidence of proficiency in the studies of the preceding classes. See "Examinations."

After the expiration of one month of a session pupils are charged from date of entrance to end of the school year.

No pupils will be received for a less time than from date of entrance to end of year, unless by special arrangement made when they enter.

No deduction is made after the pupil is entered, except at the option of the Principal; and those who leave before the close of the year will be charged for board and tuition to the end of the year, unless the pupil is compelled to leave on account of sickness, in accordance with the advice of the attending Physician of the Institute. In cases of absence from protracted illness one-half of the price of board will be refunded. No deduction can be made from tuition.

All our arrangements for teachers are made by the year, and when this is considered the justice of the above regulations will be plainly seen.

We feel that we cannot be too earnest in impressing upon parents the importance of having their daughters in place on the first day of the session. The interests of the pupil and of the Institute demand this.

Parents or guardians who place their children or wards here are understood to accept the conditions of entrance as defined above.
