Yours of the 15th inst. recd. and contents noted.
F. R. Place was Superintendent of the N. Y. State School for the
Blind from September 1893 to February 1895.

He was discharged by the Board of Managers for incompetency and insubordination. He was a teacher in the School at Jacksonville, Ill., one year. Judge Philips, one of the Board of Managers, informs me that, under no circumstances, would he have been retained another year. I am writing thus frankly to you in the interests of the unfortunate children that it is proposed to consign to his care. My personal acquaintance with Mr. Place is very slight and I have no interest in the matter other than the welfare of the children.
