ahead of the Doct amounts to about
\$1400 which is more than the
hereditas would sell for to day.
I would like to get something
for my claim but I mean
not to be able to do so. We have
had a crowd in town to day
and some feeling in consequence
of the appointment of M. J. Hawkins
and J. H. Allen County Commis-
=sionary by George Brown,

Hon C. A. Cook made a speech
in which he advised the Third
party to hold an indignation
meeting and Memorialize the
Next Legislature to repeal the
law and turn out Hawkins
and Allen,

The County affairs have been
well managed for the last
ten years but I can not
say how matters will go
under Negro and Third party
rule. The white people of
this County have made a
great mistake but it is
too late to correct the evil,
