Dear Sir:-

In the latter part of November 1894 I addressed you a letter, recommending Mr. A. Hatchett, who at that time was publisher of a paper called the "Times" at Durham, N. C. Mr. Hatchett had been a patron of our house, and his dealings having been satisfactory, we saw no objection to giving him a recommendation, which he had requested. I now desire to withcall that recommendation; my reasons for doing so you will find in the following extract from a letter I have this day received from Mr. Hatchett. It is as follows:
