have to day, I called in, at Raleigh, on
my way home, from Washington, D.C.
There I found our Rail Road bridge
matter had about come to a head -
Suit had been ordered for delay in
the commencement of the work. How-
ever, on investigation I learned, that
there was more form & there could be no
further move in it if within a reasonable
time some steps were taken to -wards
the attainment & cheaping of location of
dross or poor stone of sufficient - I
urged it would be entirely unnecessary
& useless opposition of men & without
being fit to any one - and my suggestion
had to be done, & upon the done at request
what we did propose to do, I submitted
the Substitute shown you for the original

plan thus meeting all the requirement
 of the engineers, except as to location -
 after communication of our plan by
 day & down, to whom the matter was, as
 I really referred the subject to them to
 withdraw it, & return to government,
 have it backed by such evidence as
 we could get, & to return all to him with-
 in a reasonable time, & I am engaged
 at it at this time. If I had but gone
 as expected, I should have gone more fully
 into the matter, but I have, however, made
 the situation sufficiently clear for you to
 understand it as it now exists. Do I am
 up of some kind of work ~~you can do~~ & I am informed
 there would be no difficulty in getting rea-
 sonable extension of time for completion.
 The fact that was informed me - I state &
 we had been acting under the belief, that,
 as no complaint had been made, with re-
 spect to obstructing the river. I went for
 two years by the present draw, the time
 of completion would be do on continued,
 & Donald Rossan had do informed me

which information was given
the President of the Company,
Mr W. S. Goddard & which will
explain his apparent indifference
as to the arrival orders from the
War Dept.

I delivered in person, your letter
& Map Wilson's to the Secretary of War.
They think they were referred to the

time, Acting as Chief Engineer

in his office the next day -
