My Dear Governor:

I received a few days since a letter from Mr. James Reeves, formerly of this place, who was sent to the penitentiary three years ago for a seven years term. He writes to me, requesting that I use my influence with you in his behalf. I do this with trepidation. In the first place, I know you are governed entirely by duty, and that you will not reverse a decision of the Court without just cause; but I write to ask, my dear sir, if it is in the line of your duty to show some clemency to this unfortunate man, consistent with your idea of justice, I would appreciate highly your interference in his behalf. He is supposed to be weak-minded, and I really think the most of his crime was committed while he was under the influence of strong drink. He tells me he has a position offered him in Virginia, which he could fill, provided he should meet with your mercy. I write this letter at his earnest request.
