Hon. Elias Carr. Gov. of N.C.

Lately I have thought a great deal
of the water supply of eastern N.C.

and of irrigation.

To us, in the eastern part of the State,
pure drinking water is of the
first importance to health, and
equally so is ~~the~~ irrigation to the
farmers. I think we can do
both. I am confident we can
have the first - pure water to drink.
The State Geologist could be of
great help to both. This investigation
of these subjects would be to us
of as great a importance ~~than~~ as the
mineral interest is to the West.
The health of our whole section
would be another thing as to ultimate.

our own agricultural interest
imposes to an inevitable degne.
Good health is the greatest wealth.
the health of the working man
is his greatest Capital; ~~to~~ ^{and}
and also, his value to the state
depends on his health. I am
only making notes of these thoughts.
which you will will to your
ter suggestion of others, and
of their import to the individual
and the State.

I do not know the amount or
opportunity of the risk to the
work of the Geologist. It
occurs to me that the cost in
first of the State should cover
some part of the labor of
the Geologist. I am not

Complaining but suggesting.
the time is coming when
irrigation is to be considered all
important to the farmer. and
the matter must have its
share of our attention. of this
you have doubtless thought
as I do.

What I want is broad. or
Artisan well.

In one part of the Río, at Gordon,
there is a slight overfall
from the outlet of less ft. and
at over an hundred ft. at
my front at which the pipe
has been let down, the
water comes to about 15 or 20
feet of the surface. - Near-
enough for the farm to be
used.

Should it not be the proper
thing for the Geologist to
investigate this matter. It may
be that over flowing wells may
be found. If so, thy would serve
for pure water to drink, and
for irrigation for our crops. -
the two things, the most important
to us. as would bring more
money to the City as stock
than the gold and silver mines.
Pardon me for calling your
attention to these matters. whilst
I think of inestimable interest to
our Citizens and the State. "Public
Health is public wealth"
