Dear Elias Carr:

Gov. of N.C.

Your ultimatum reply to mine is just received.

You said that there is to be a mill bond or mill by the State at the State farm.

I would be pleased to get the appliances used at State farms in some way - that we could make the tyal at this place. The State could aid in the case that much if no more.

I think I could raise some money for that purpose in one town. I would like to

See informed of the cost  
and of the appliances for  
the well boring. A  
drum mill would not  
do on purpose. I wish  
to go below the sand  
deposits. It comes and the  
washing out fast by the  
water from one water works  
which is a big part of the  
work.

I wrote to Prof. Holmes  
asking for this information  
but have seen no reply.—  
If Prof. Holmes becomes interested  
in this matter I would give him  
all the aid that I can command.  
as could get for him samples  
of the ground as the auger  
goes down. I put it  
up in the tube next  
for this purpose, as a

Specimen in the State museum.

This can be made a profitable  
as poplar state work. and  
can be turned to great  
good & profit.

Should not the State protect the  
Health as well as the Health  
of the citizen? Really, the  
Health is a great part of the  
health of the State. The healthy  
man does more work, &  
makes more money - less than  
loss of time and expense of his  
diseases. And, the cost of a  
healthy nation falls for more  
money. This being true, it  
is clearly true that the  
State should form a monetary  
nur work upon the health of  
the citizen, as the healthiness of

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of the Country. Health is  
wealth, as the only Capital  
the Colon has is his health.  
The State should protect it as  
it does the land or the ponds.  
This is the Cold materialistic  
view of the subject - not Counting  
the pain and suffering Conveyed  
and Caused by sickness.  
It seems to me that the State  
through its Geologist Con-  
gratly help us as to our  
health - as ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> value of  
property, and so increase taxes.  
When the Loring brothers  
has been used on State farm  
we could get it to use  
it by permission of the State  
This, if no more the State could  
do. I think it should do more.



The State follows the system,  
but leaves the Citizen to  
the vagaries of Malacca.  
I have spoken to no one  
about the letters I write to  
you or my intended efforts  
for the betterment of our  
people's health, and do  
not intend to do so, till I  
have gotten something tangible  
or the information needed in  
the case.

You bring on costing more  
care and ful the import  
of the subject to our people.

As to irrigation. It is not so  
much the quantity of rain fall,  
as it is the time of the rain  
fall, in my opinion, as

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Popper irrigation would  
increase the production of  
our Soil to an insatiable  
extent. Rice could be grown  
on the hills, as is done in China  
by means of irrigation, & the  
truck interest would be  
equally improved.

But, I say you, I know your  
time is all taken up by  
State matters.

Please to get through  
Prof. Holmes or Prof. Jones  
one acquainted with the subject,  
the Popper applies to the  
cost of it for growing crops well.
